HOUSING DISCRIMINATION IS ILLEGAL

Fight a discriminatory eviction, enforce your rights. It is against the law to evict or someone because of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, gender identification or expression, family status, disability, source of income, age, or veteran status. Retaliation for exercising your rights is also illegal.

Housing discrimination may look like this:

- “My other tenants are uncomfortable around you.”
- “I reported harassment, now I’m being evicted.”
- “They are evicting me for non-payment, but my benefits don’t arrive until the 8th.”
- “everything was fine until I needed an accessible shower.”
